## 2022-2023 Influenza Vaccine Shipment Update

Dear VFC Providers,

Influenza vaccines are arriving at the CDC distribution center and are being shipped to providers who completed the seasonal pre-book in FL SHOTS. Providers were only able to pre-book the number of 0.5mL doses they needed. The specific brand of vaccine that is shipped is determined by what is available at the CDC distribution center. The following pediatric vaccines will be available this year:

Fluzone-Quad	Sanofi	49281-0422-50	10 pack 0.5mL single dose syringe	6 months +
Flucelvax-Quad	Seqirus	70461-0322-03	10 pack 0.5mL single dose syringe	6 months +

**Please Note**: Pre-book is now closed. If you did not pre-book, you may contact the VFC Program at <u>FloridaVFC@flhealth.gov</u> to request doses be placed in pre-book for you. Please include your VFC PIN. Flu vaccine orders <u>will not</u> be available for ordering in Florida SHOTS, but the order status can be tracked on your Order Requests page.

The VFC Program will continue to ship providers up to 50% of their pre-book request as the vaccine becomes available. Once all providers have received half of their pre-book flu vaccines, the remaining vaccine doses should be requested through Florida SHOTS by using the Order Requests page. At that time, those providers who did not pre-book may request flu vaccines.
